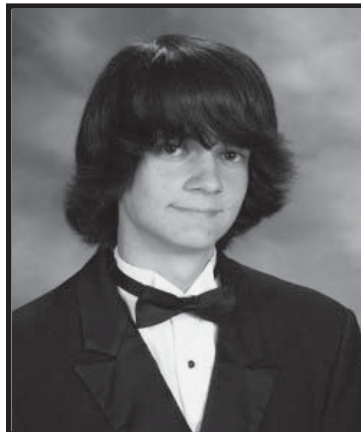

Emily Koenig's passion for running has been an inspiration to all who know her. She's become a household name not only in Academy, but throughout our track and field region, the state of Texas, and beyond. Many have seen her putting in extra miles and hours on our own trail, she's gained a reputation for excellence in cross-country and various competitions beyond the scope of AHS, and her coaches delighted in overhearing comments in San Antonio in places like the breakfast area at the hotel as well as at the track at Judson High School about "that Koenig girl from Academy". In addition, it wasn't just the loyal Lady Bee fans getting pumped up about her lapping runners in the 3200, busting across a full 14 seconds ahead of second place, or setting a new Region IV record in winning the 1600; there was a roar of cheering bringing her home in her championship performances!

Emily has worked hard to complement her natural abilities and love for running. Her dedication to Coach Bender's distance practices in track and Coach Pursche's cross-country training as well as the extra she puts in personally make what she does on the track or the course look easy. On the contrary, it is far from easy; however, she is the epitome of constancy in work ethics, dedication to training, and the pursuit of excellence. She trusts her training as well as her coaches, and therefore, the pay-off has been huge.

Emily has earned her first-place seeding at the state meet in both the 3200 and 1600. She has broken her own school records this season, setting a new 3200 record at Texas Relays in April; she has continued to improve in the 1600, breaking her old record for the first time at Texas Relays, again at the District 25AA meet and again in conjunction with setting the new regional record.

We are so very proud of Emily. She has been a model of excellence, inspiring in her training, being a leader to her peers and a role model to those that will follow her in the years to come. She has been a coach's dream, free of the drama unfortunately so often associated with athletes of her caliber. Her family has been respectful of our coaches, supportive of our staff and program plans, and most importantly, supportive of Emily in a way that allowed her to grow in her plans and her love of her sport. Emily will finish her high school career at the State Meet in Austin, running the 3200 May 14 and the 1600 May 15. From there, she rides a full scholarship to the University of Texas at Arlington to continue her dreams at the collegiate level.

The High School Band went to two contests this March, where they received Sweepstakes (the highest honor awarded) both in Pre-UIL and UIL rated competition. They were also invited to perform at the University of Texas in Austin for the Texas State Wind Ensemble Festival on May 8th, which is a honor reserved for the best bands in the state!

Several students also attended the UIL Solo/Ensemble competition in February, many of whom brought home medals. Josh Thomas and Berklee King played the highest level of solo from memory and earned a 1st division rating, certifying them to the State level of competition. They will perform at Hendrickson High School in Pflugerville on May 31st.

The AMS Band, composed of both 7th and 8th graders, competed in a Pre-UIL contest at McGregor High School at the end of March, where they also took Sweepstakes. Their performance was one of only three all day to receive this honor, the other two ensembles being high school groups! 22 of these students also attended Riesel Solo and Ensemble competition, bringing home 21 1st Division medals and 1 2nd Division Ribbon!

The tour will consist of the 6th Grade's Performance at the University of Mary Hardin Baylor Band Festival on May 5th, the Spring Concert on the High School Lawn May 6th, a Middle School trip to Six Flags Fiesta Texas May 7th, and the High School's performance at The University of Texas and trip to Schlitterbahn on May 8th. 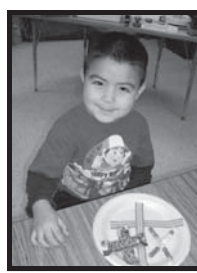

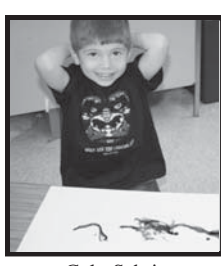

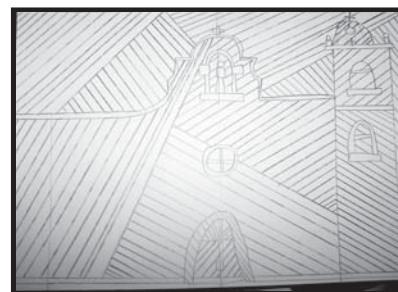
Maniac Magee

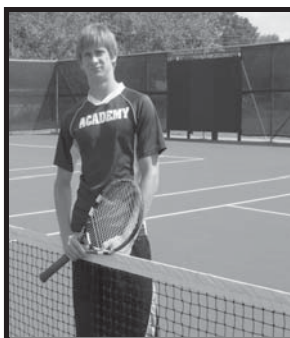
